



Among Giants





Pass the Word

In 1933, a young sailor named Les Spencer brought a fellow shipmate, Gurney Harris, to meet Dawson Trotman. Les wanted Dawson to share with Gurney some Bible teaching. "Tell Gurney what you taught me in the Word of God," Les said. Dawson quickly replied, "If you can't teach Gurney what I have taught you; I've failed!" This began a ministry principle of teaching others how to share the Good News of the Bible. These shipmates began to call themselves the Navigator Gospel Team. Soon other Navigator Teams formed and began using the same Navigator Principle to share the Gospel message.

Later, the Navigator Team saw Gurney Harris, my father, leave for Congo to serve with AIM. Les Spencer, for whom I was named, started to work with the American Sunday School Union and other Navigators and began a discipleship ministry with Billy Graham.

Dawson Trotman died saving a student from drowning at the Word of Life camp in 1956, but he touched the world with the

Word of God. Billy Graham (1940) gave the message at Dawson's funeral. I was deeply impressed as my father retold the story in the Congo. Dad said that after hearing of the death of Dawson, Billy Graham was quoted as saying, "Oh God, help me rededicate my life!" I desired to know where Billy Graham had gone to Bible School and a pastor friend, O.C. Clark (1962), sent a catalog recommending Trinity College of Florida. The rest is history.

As Alumni, we have a story which is continuing today. Our Alumni around the world are changing the world for Christ. One such couple is Keith (1962) and Yvonne (1964) Lamb. It was a joy to honor Keith and Yvonne as Alumni of the Year for their Bible Teaching ministry in the Midwest at the 75th Anniversary Celebration Banquet. Keith and Yvonne also sent two of their children to Trinity College, Andrew Lamb (1988) and Kim (1990) Richards.


A Man for

All Seasons

Trinity College of Florida proudly has laid claim to a special relationship with Billy Graham. It was in the "springtime" of this young man's life, he attended the small Bible College, then known as Florida Bible Institute. Now after a lifetime of global ministry,

the "winter" of life gives cause to reflect: What discernable influences of College life contributed to his worldwide ministry. Just as the fabric of every life consists of many threads: family, church, community, education, etc., so Dr. Graham was impacted by many factors.

However, Trinity's influence is apparent in the historic ministry which this evangelist has had.

a Passion for Souls

Billy Graham has commented that one of his most enduring memories of Bible College was of a "white-haired professor (whose name was forgotten) standing in the classroom before his students with tears streaming down his face" and pleading with the students to bring the lost to the Savior. It was not the quality of his speech, nor the logic of his thought, nor the depth of his teaching presentation. Rather, it was the passionate burning heart of an instructor who was so aflame with desire to reach a lost world that it overflowed contagiously to the students.

a Divine Calling

Pestiny is tied to Divine Purpose. It was while studying and examining the truth of God's Word that the conviction of personal calling came to Billy Graham. His education in the Scriptures along with the witness of the College community of faith, became the womb of vision which birthed a lifelong calling. Education, politics, business, communications and other fields shouted for his attention, but all the world's good was rejected for heaven's best. Billy Graham vielded his life to God's call while a student and has been faithful ever

since with tenacious persistence, beginning

one night of surrender on a golf course green and continuing his entire lifetime even through earth's halls of prestige and power.

a World Vision

Christian and Missionary Alliance as was Dr. John Minder, who befriended Billy Graham and gave special encouragement to him as a student and offered counsel in Graham's early ministry. These men carried deep convictions about the task of world evangelization that extended far beyond the shores of the United States. From the start of his ministry, Billy Graham has been an Evangelist to the entire world, including difficult places such as China and North Korea.

The Bible Says

Instruction in the Word of God, with peripheral philosophical and academic disciplines, gave a foundational basis to Billy's ministry. Studies all centered directly in the Bible and its impact in practical ministry. Later, when faced with critical arguments questioning his straightforward Biblical approach as too simplistic, Graham settled the issue in a commitment made by faith to the veracity of the Bible as God's inspired

authoritative Word. A new power and dimension of confidence emerged in his life and ministry.

Billy Graham became known for the use of the phrase, "the Bible says". Often holding his Bible in hand, he quoted it profusely. He was taught the Bible at Trinity College of Florida and was taught to relate Biblical thinking with application in other disciplines in his continuing education.

At Trinity College of Florida many of the professors in the early days were practitioners, pastors and ministry leaders who were busily engaged in ministry. They taught students, while they were themselves actively serving Christ. The instruction had the fresh realism of ministry. Practical exercises encouraged students to apply the instruction in meaningful ways such as gospel teams, street preaching, trailer parks, prison visits and tract distribution in the slum and mission districts. 

motivation of early believers. There is an end of the age. Eternity is before all of us. We must work while it is day to bring as many as we can to faith in our coming King. Over and over again, Billy Graham has preached on the end of the world, the second coming of Christ,

and the signs of the times; woven into these themes, he passionately preached the evangelistic appeal to repent and to receive Christ as Savior and coming King.

After a lifetime of faithful ministry, Billy Graham, as God's Ambassador, has represented well the King of Kings, Heaven's Sovereign. The Trinity College of Florida family thanks God for Billy

Graham, A Man for All Seasons, who even in his "winter" years holds to those formative truths, distinctives that were God-instilled in the springtime years he spent among us.

May 2007 dedication of the Rev. Billy Graham's Library included a guest list of 1,500. It was humbling to be among those invited to the celebration. Held on the grounds of the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association Headquarters, the dedication was a moving tribute commemorating the life and ministry of one of the world's greatest Evangelists. The sights, sounds, thoughts, and emotions from this experience will not soon be forgotten. This is the journey to that moment in history.

The Gourney Begins

The weather has been unusually hot for this time of year in North Carolina - so I've been told by the natives - but the drive to the state has been pleasant as Florida flat lands turn to gentle Carolina rolling hills. Leaving from the college that gave Billy Graham his training for ministry and arriving now at the organization that bears his name has been a profound and moving experience.

When the shuttle bus arrives at the library grounds, we see reporters, cameramen, sound and lighting technicians, and others all jockeying for the right spot and location.

In front of the library stands a massive open white tent with hundreds of white chairs lined side by side in preparation for tomorrow's ceremony. The tent is reminiscent of an old church revival meeting. It is a tabernacle, waiting to receive the minister of the Gospel we have all traveled to honor.

As we exit the bus, we see for the first time the Billy Graham Library.

My eyes are drawn to the wooden barn which stands central in the scene and I cannot help but look at the huge glass cross - several stories high - which serves as the entrance. To the left of the barn stands a massive silo giving the campus a distinctive farm atmosphere. To the right of the barn stands the original 1927 Graham family home. We are told it was painstakingly moved brick by brick and restored here.

To the library's far left is a small prayer garden which takes visitors

into a small reflective cove. All over the grounds speakers softly play the hymn, *Just As I Am*. This was the invitation hymn sung at Billy Graham Crusades. I snap a couple of pictures realizing that they will never capture the full emotion I am experiencing.

I approach the library entrance and gaze up at the glass cross. It reminds me of the gospel message that we must all pass through the cross to find forgiveness of sin and a restored relationship with God.

As I enter the hall, my eyes are compelled to look up - as if searching for God Himself. Immediately, I see the scripture etched in the cross beams. I recognize John 3:16. Scripture is in all the beams; verses Billy Graham has no less preached hundreds of thousands of times.

I have to look hard before I can even find a picture of Billy Graham, the humble man whom this site honors. As I stroll through the library, I see Franklin Graham, Billy's son and the organization's president, giving an interview. My dad stops, shakes his hand, and engages in a brief conversation. I snap another picture.





After a short film, we enter a series of rooms, the first of which is a replica of a 1949 Los Angeles tent revival. All the rooms represent some facet of Graham's life. The most captivating is the room dedicated to his wife, Ruth. The love story is gripping - the "Best Christian I know" Billy says of Ruth.

I see familiar faces of ones who have been connected with Billy Graham and Trinity College of Florida: John Corts, John Minder, and W.T. Watson. I even view Billy's Commencement program when he graduated from Trinity College of Florida (then known as Florida Bible Institute) and I am impressed by all the preaching Bibles on display; each is extensively underlined and marked revealing the Graham train of thought.

The final exhibit hall holds all of Billy Graham's awards: his Presidential Medal of Freedom from Ronald Reagan, his honorary knighthood from Queen Elizabeth II, and his Congressional Gold Medal.

The Billy Graham Library was less about the man and more about the message. Billy Graham's humility, simplicity, and passion for Christ flow out of the exhibit halls. My entire experience can be summed up by viewing one verse which was extensively underlined by Billy in one of his preaching Bibles. John 3:30, "He must increase, but I must decrease."

The Day of Dedication

We arrive at the grounds of the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association about 11:15am. The number of reporters has nearly doubled since yesterday. My father and I secure great seats. The two-and-one-half hour wait begins.

Eventually, I like other men, have to take off my suit coat. We are told the temperature is to reach 91 degrees.

As we look out from the tent, we see the Library in the distance; each time the glass doors open, people jump out of their seats wanting to catch a glimpse of Billy Graham or one of the former U.S. presidents who have been invited.

The first guest to come is former First Lady Barbara Bush. She makes her way down to thunderous applause. Then quiet again - finally, the doors open and out walks former presidents, Carter, Bush, and Clinton followed by Franklin and Billy Graham. Billy looks frail and uses a walker. The group

poses for pictures before Billy gets into a golf cart. The former presidents walk together. What a sight. Men who have led our country now honoring a man who spiritually guided them.

Each president shares how Billy Graham impacted his life. The most moving is former President George H. W. Bush's tear-filled ending. Finally, Billy Graham speaks.

"I feel like I have been attending my own funeral," he jokes. He speaks from the heart and though he is frail, you can sense the passion in his heart for Christ.

We sing two hymns: How Great Thou Art and To God Be the Glory. Three ministers offer dedicatory prayers. And then it is over.

What an experience. It made me want to live a life of humility, simplicity, and passion. Billy Graham impacted the world and changed people's lives by preaching the Gospel. He has seen and been used by God for great things. I was part of history.














VP for Academic Affairs Named Accrediting Commission Chair

Dr. Jim Lanpher, Vice President for Academic Affairs, has been named the Chairman of the Commission on Accreditation for the Association for Biblical Higher Education (ABHE). ABHE is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation as an institutional accrediting agency. The mission of ABHE is "to provide accreditation and services for institutions and programs of biblical higher education within Canada, the United States, and related territories". The accrediting process is coordinated through the Commission on Accreditation. There are currently ninety-six ABHE accredited institutions, eight candidate institutions for accreditation, twenty-seven applicant institutions, and sixty affiliate institutions.





Dr. Lanpher has served on the ABHE Commission on Accreditation for two years as a member-at-large and most recently as the Commission Secretary. Dr. Lanpher's Chairmanship will be for one year. Dr. Lanpher has served as the Vice President for Academic Affairs at Trinity College of Florida since the fall of 1999. Prior to his tenure at Trinity, Dr. Lanpher served as an Associate Professor of Bible & Theology at Crown College in St. Paul, Minnesota. Dr. Lanpher is active in his community serving as Treasurer of the Georgetown Alumni Club of Tampa Bay, Guardian ad Litem for the Sixth Judicial Circuit Court of Florida, a member of the School Advisory Council for Trinity Elementary and Trinity Oaks Elementary, a member of the Rotary Club of Trinity, and a member of Trinity Community Church.




Trinity College Appoints First Research Professor

Trinity College of Florida is proud to announce the appointment of Dr. Tom Woodward as its first Research Professor. While continuing to teach at Trinity College of Florida, the new appointment will allow Dr. Woodward to pursue his research, publication, and lecturing activities in the areas of intelligent design and apologetics. The College is pleased to appoint Dr. Woodward to this new position which will allow him to continue teaching, as well as, to represent the College throughout the world through his writing and lecturing.

Dr. Woodward completed his doctoral work at the University of South Florida. His field of concentration was the Rhetoric of Science. His dissertation was published by Baker Books under the title *Doubts about Darwin*, and was named 2004 Book of the Year by *Christianity Today*. Since 1988, Dr. Woodward has directed Trinity College of Florida's Center for University Ministries (CFUM), along with an evangelical teaching and discipleship ministry, and The C.S. Lewis Society, which is housed at Trinity College of Florida.

The Society and CFUM together host the apologetics.org website, hold conferences and seminars on evidences for the Christian faith on university campuses, and produce video and other resources. Dr. Woodward's latest book, *Darwin Strikes Back*, was published by Baker Books (2006). Dr. Woodward also hosts a weekly radio program on WTBN AM 570 & 910 entitled *Darwin or Design*.


Consumers Digest Magazine Names Trinity College of Florida Best Value

Consumers Digest magazine named Trinity College of Florida the number two best value in Private Colleges and Universities in the nation. The June 2007 issue of Consumers

Digest lists the top twenty-five best values for schools using a

formula combining academic criteria for first-time freshmen (standardized test scores, high-school rank, grade-point average) with the institution's educational quality (4 and 6 year graduation rate, student-to-faculty ratio, percentage of faculty holding a PhD). Together

Consumers Digest formed a value-index which was then combined with the cost of attending the school to determine which colleges and universities offered the best academic value per dollar.




help parents and students find schools that will meet families' performance and financial requirements."




