And not one of them is forgotten before God. But the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Do not fear therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows."

There is Power ... and then there is POWER! God signals to us through Jesus the following supernatural truths:

- 1. There is Life after the body ceases to function. There is movement, location, and direction after death. God is the One in Charge!
- 2. There is Value to every Human Being. God does not forget anyone. God does not ignore anyone who is searching.
- 3. There is Detail, Order, and Importance in all things! Nothing is wasted! Nothing is ignored in the economy of God. There is a purpose and plan.
- 4. There is Divine Concern that you know and not fear, but choose wisely!

- --a young woman, seeking comfort in the arms of many men-- but, LORD, YOU brought her to find her identity in YOU alone...

And YOU are the God of transformation who has broken cycles of abuse, removed the chains of addiction, freed us from the prisons of our own anxiety and depression, and tattooed every scar as a reminder of who YOU are.

As we contemplate where today's commencement will lead, LORD, help us to hear you, to see you, to know you, and to follow you NOW-- More Than EVER.
