We hope that this yearbook will be a blessing to all who read it and that Christ might be glorified on each page.






Chief Silver Tongue

Miss Jessie E, Reinhart


Miss Jessie E. Reinhart, a charter member of the executive board of Trinity College of Clearwater, went to be with the Lord Friday morning, January 23, 1959. Miss Reinhart was 81 years of age and had been a friend of youth through her entire life.

When Trinity College was organized in 1932 (then known as the Florida Bible Institute), Miss Reinhart accepted a place on the board of the invitation of the founder of the school, Dr. W. T. Watson. Through most of those years she served faithfully as the secretary of the board. She was one of two of the original incorporators of the school.

In the early days of the school, during the days of the well remembered depression, Miss Reinhart by prayer and with her means helped in a very substantial way. Her gift was in the form of an annuity and she often stated, "the best investment I ever made was in Trinity College for not have I only received my interest faithfully, but I have had a definite part in the training of young people for the Lord's work."

Through the years Miss Reinhart was a close friend of Dr. & Mrs. Watson and other officials and workers in the school. Even though she never married, she often referred to the young men and women who had attended Trinity College as "my boys and girls."

Miss Reichart will long be remembered by the students and faculty of Trinity College. Her life of praise was a benediction to all.
