


. . . the '60 Beacon. Seldom does a school come upon a teacher as versatile and dedicated to his task as Mr. Peper.






AT TRINITY

For the rest of our lives, we will undoubtedly draw from Life at Trinity, especially our academic life.



AT TRINITY AMONG STUDENTS





The memories of the 1959-60 year will linger long after dismissal. For the class has now spent two constructive years at their "second home" where life is grand.




Trinity College was a sunny, welcome spot to a large freshman class which set foot on the campus for the first time September 12.

PRAYER GROUPS


Life at Trinity is a life built upon a foundation of prayer. One of the chief links in the prayer chain is the morning prayer session.






