






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In Memory of Faithful Service:


For









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C.S. Lewis said in *God in the Dock*:

"What are we to make of Christ?" There is no question of what we can make of Him. It is entirely a question of what He intends to make of us.

"The things He says are very different from what any other teacher has said. Others say, 'This is the truth about the Universe. This is the way you ought to go.' but He says, 'No man can reach absolute reality, except through Me. Try to retain your own life and you will be inevitably ruined. Give yourself away and you will be saved.' He says, 'If you are numbered of Me, if, when you hear this nail, you turn the other way, I also will look the other way when I come again as God without disguise. . . If you put yourself first you will be lost. Come to Me everyone who is carrying a heavy load. I will set that right. Your sins, all of them, are wiped out; I can do that. I am Re-birth, I am Life. I am your Food. And finally, do not be afraid; I have overcome the whole Universe.' That is the issue."

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
