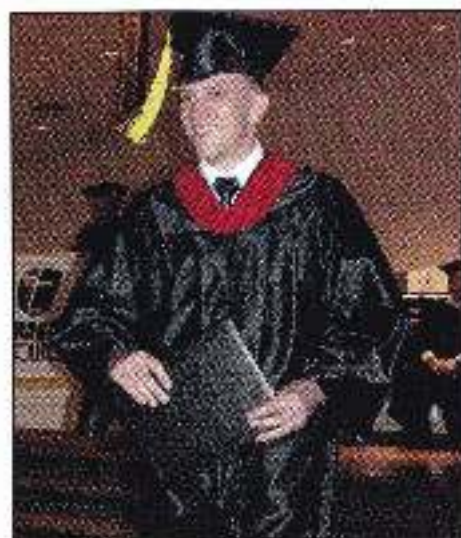


Blythe Thompson

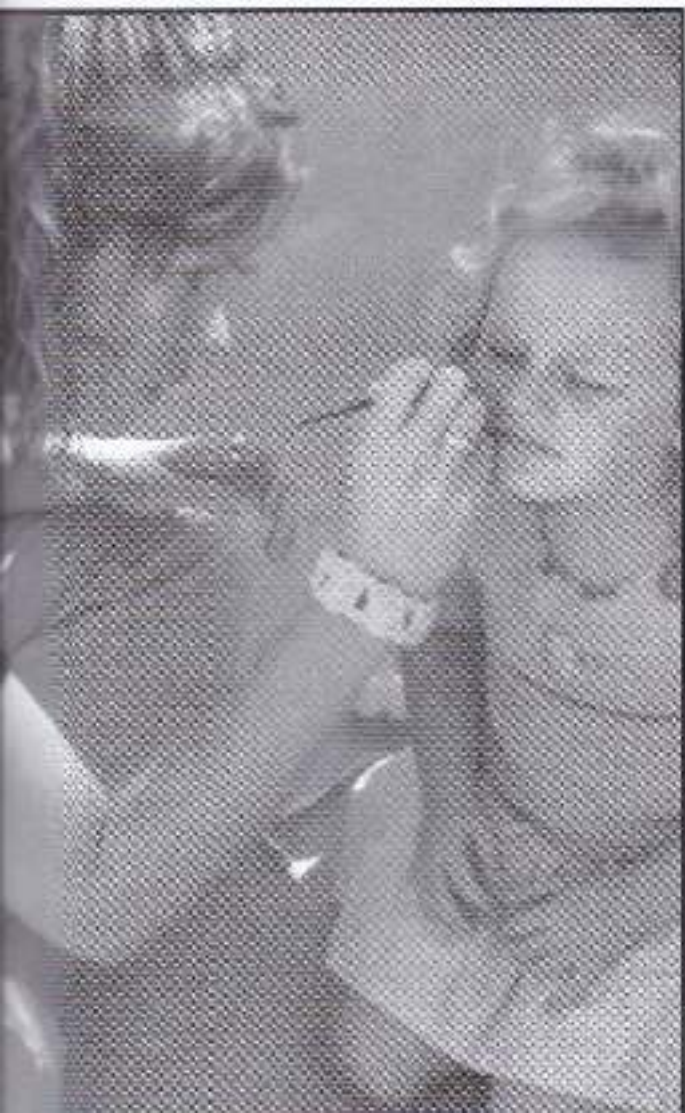

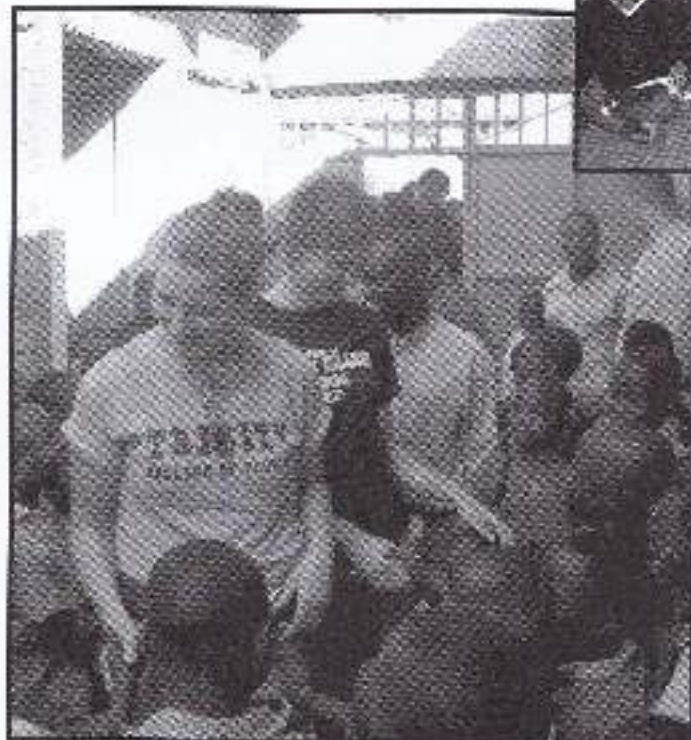

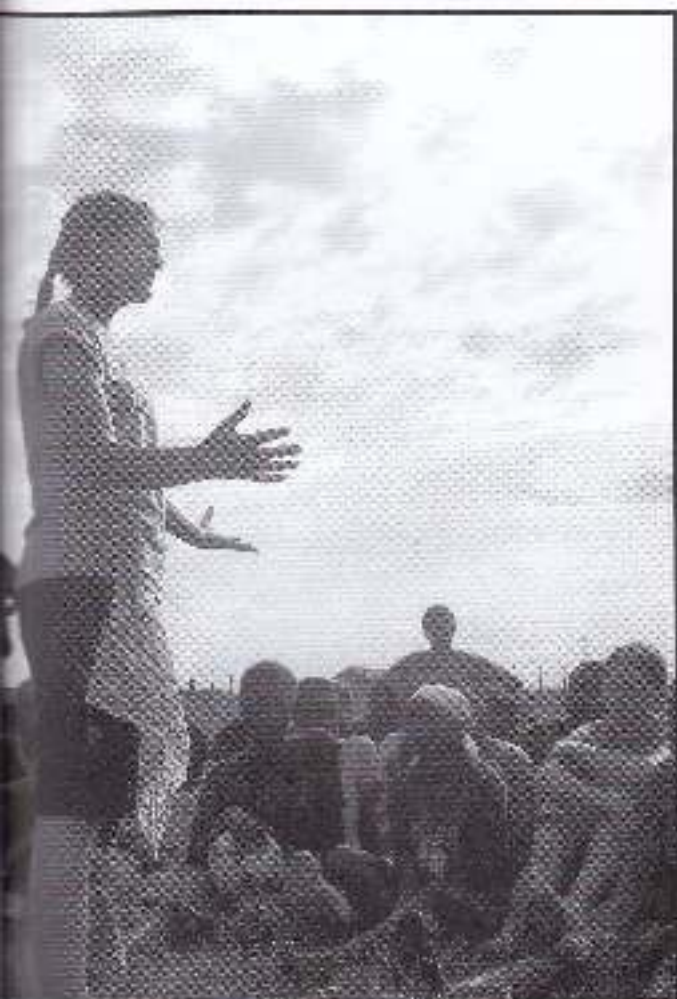

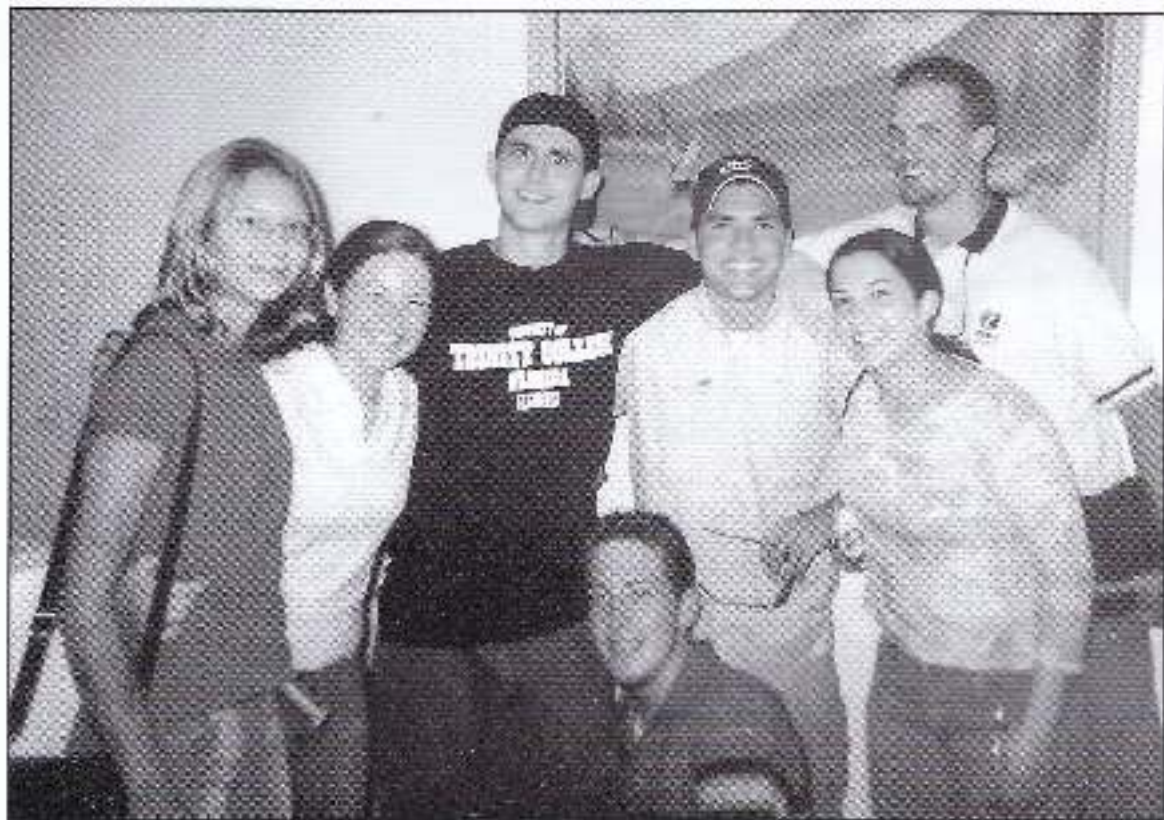
