



COVID-19 Safety Protocol Policy for Symptoms and Positive COVID Test Results

[Updated 1/26/2023]

Policy Basis

In general, all policies adhered to by Trinity College of Florida follow either the recommendations made by the [CDC](#) or by the [Florida Department of Health](#).

Policy for Exposure to COVID or COVID Symptoms

- Anyone exhibiting symptoms or has been exposed to a person that is confirmed positive for COVID should follow the guidelines of the CDC as described in the [Isolation and Exposure Calculator](#).
 - Anyone exhibiting symptoms of the following should report to their supervisor (If an employee) or Director of Student Life (if a student):¹
 - Fever or feeling feverish (chills, sweating)
 - Cough
 - Mild or moderate difficulty breathing
 - Sore throat
 - Muscle aches or body aches
 - Vomiting or diarrhea
 - If you have been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID
 - Be alert for symptoms. Watch for fever, cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19.
 - Take your temperature and [follow CDC guidance](#) if you have symptoms.
- Who should I contact if I have symptoms, have been exposed, or tested positive?
 - Alert your supervisor if an employee,

- Director of Student Development if a student.

Policy for Visitors with Symptoms of COVID

- Visitors should not enter any building on campus if they are experiencing the above symptoms.

Policy for Positive COVID Test Results

- If you test positive for COVID, you should follow the guidelines of the CDC as described in the [Isolation and Exposure Calculator](#).
- Employees and Students should coordinate their responsibilities with their supervisor or professor during their isolation period.
