PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Intercultural Studies major focuses on preparing students with the cultural intelligence and strategic competencies necessary for effective ministry in our intercultural world. This four-year program includes several electives, allowing students to pursue a secondary specific skill set in preparation for more specialized forms of crosscultural ministry. The program also includes an immersive, global experience as well as local intercultural opportunities.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the Intercultural Studies major, the student will:

- Appreciate fundamental differences between cultures, recognizing their own cultural leaniings while also honoring the richness and diversity that other cultures offer. (Cultural Anthropology)
- Understand the core story of the gospel and how to articulate it in a variety of cultural settings. (Cross **Cultural Communications**)
- Articulate the timeless and global mission of God's people, finding evidence of God at work throughout the world and looking for ways to join and expand His global movement. (Missional Theology)
- Evaluate past, current and potential approaches to global ministry, noting which approaches preserve dignity, encourage development and achieve sustainability in the indigenous context. (Missions Seminar)
- Integrate principles and theories from the classroom into practical ministry in a global environment. (Missions Apprenticeship)
- Apply cultural Intelligence and cross-cultural best practices to indigenous development in a global context (Global Ministry Practicum).
